The meeting was called to order at 5:44. Devotions were read by Marlene. Places council members have seen Jesus included care and help from family members after a loss, young adults reaching out to a member in various places, and positive changes in health. Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda was made by Roger and seconded by Marlene. Carried.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Mike met with Personnel. Rich Rasmusson resigned his position. Personnel positions are a threeyear term. Two people are needed now. Our constitution states that they will be appointed by the Pastor and Council President. Personnel conducted exit interviews with Pastor Kate and Dwight and Patti Belsheim.

Pastor Mike's contract ends at the end of June. Pastor Mike is willing to work month to month starting in August if he has not received a call or if Grace Lutheran has not found a pastor. He will have one week of paid vacation to use in July. He will need to take the rest of July unpaid. He is unable to work in July as he is preparing for a move. Pastor Mike will work on covering the Sundays in July with pulpit supply. A motion was made by Roger to approve the staffing plan and seconded by Harry. Carried.

A rafting trip down the St. Louis river near Carlton has been planned for June 25th. Participants must be 12 or older and there is a minimum of ten people for the group rate. The cost is \$30.00 per person. Another release time teacher has been found for May. There are several changes planned for Confirmation in the fall. Students will eat dinner with their small group and mentor at 6:30. They will next move to the large group for learning, then to small groups with mentors and end with a large group closing. Pastor Mike met with a group of confirmation parents and these were some of the ideas from that group. He will continue to look at curriculum.

<u>Approval of the April 10th, 2017</u> minutes with a correction to the number of youth confirmed. There was 18 rather than 21. Motion to approve minutes was made by Roger and seconded by Laura. Carried.

<u>Treasurer Reports:</u> There was a positive balance at the end of the month. April consisted of five Sundays, Easter and Confirmation. Expenses were average. A motion was made by Roger to approve the Treasurers report and seconded by Laura. Carried. WELCA: The report was briefly reviewed.

<u>Ministry Reports:</u> Social Justice submitted a report. The Woodbury concert was very successful with our share of it being \$8, 994.70 to benefit the food shelf. The Volunteer Coordinators report was briefly discussed.

Unfinished Business:

- a. Technology Upgrades in the FLC: Work will be done May 9th to complete upgrades. The screen and cage will be completed.
- b. Call Committee Update: Some tweaks are needed on MSP. We are waiting for a call. Pastor Mike will help with inter view questions for call committee.
- c. Youth and Family Ministry: The role of the Youth and Family Ministry leadership team was discussed. They will act as a call committee for Youth and Family, and give input into what that program will look like. Additional members are needed and several people will be contacted to see if they have an interest. Kelly will email people with a meeting date. Discussed the need for a possible part time youth person in the interim. There may possibly be people in our community who may have an interest.
- d. Visitation Pastor: Members from Finance, Executive Committee and Personnel conducted an informal interview with a retired pastor. They will be looking at others as well. The draft for the job is complete but will be reviewed with the candidate.

New Business:

- a. Custodian: Jason and Ryan Sjoberg will take care of the grass. The building will be closed if no staff is present.
- b. Summer Youth Activities: VBS takes place June 12th-16th, a white water rafting trip is scheduled for June 25th, a scav enger hunt for youth entering 7th grade-9th grade is taking place July 19th, and a St. Paul Saints game is being organized for August 13th. Harry will work on putting the Saints game together. He will make a sign-up sheet with a deadline of June 25th.
- c. Transportation Guidelines: Tabled until June meeting.

Correspondence/Future Meeting Dates: The next Council meeting will take place on June 12th at 5:30pm. Motion to adjourn at 8:06 by Roger and seconded by Laura. Carried. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.



Summary of the Women of the ELCA Gathering at Sugar Lake Lodge near Grand Rapids by Barbara Orstad. Thank you so much for opportunity to attend the June 8th and 9th gathering "Walking in the Light".

We began on Wednesday evening by meeting new and old friends and joined together in a Polka Praise Time. On Thursday morning a big semi-trailer was in a parking lot, boxes upon boxes of quilts and other kits were unloaded from cars, pickups and trailers and loaded into the semi-trailer. What a sight to see all the donations. We all joined together for the opening of the gathering Litany and the purpose and mission statements. Lucy Schultz was our voting delegate so she attended all the business sessions. I was a non-voting attendee and there were workshops to attend. There were 6 very interesting workshops, but I could only attend 3, so the choices were difficult.

Rev. Dr. David M Carlson presented his research. We learned to grow in understanding local earth stewardship as a vital component of participating in God's mission today. His work is rooted in scripture and Lutheran Theology. We explored how congregations can take steps in integrate creation care practically in ministry areas of worship education, congregational life, building and grounds, and community engagement. Pastor Dave believes the church in general and Lutherans in particular are well suited to help society address ecological needs and the problems of climate change, and that congregations are ideal settings for modeling the kind of earth stewardship needed for a more sustainable world. He gave many resources if we feel this is a project we want to work on.

Kim Dickey – Global Health Ministries - Lutheran nonprofit based in Minneapolis. GHM has partnered with Lutheran churches in Liberia for almost 30 years and was instrumental in the PV for Phebe Project which is a dream come true. GHM partners with Lutheran churches in more than 11 countries around the globe, equipping mission hospitals and clinics for their work and supporting health programs that serve some of the world's most vulnerable people. Many of the NE MN Synod congregations also send Hospice and Newborn Kits and rolled bandages to GHM.

Joan Iveson – Journaling: Creating you own Sacred Writings. Joan states journaling is an ancient way to reflect on the world around us and within us. Writing and drawing a few pages a day often opens up pathways to new thoughts, new insights and new energy. The pen is often the key that unlocks the door to a hidden world of peace, beauty and a renewed sense of being protected by a good, generous and gracious God.

Naomi Nelson and Kathy Sauve – Lutheran Social Service Saving Grace. This presentation focused on the local need of understanding and responding to the specific needs of sexually exploited and sec trafficked youth in Central MN. They explained the tactics of traffickers use to recruit victim and how they gain power and control of the victim. The State of MN is responding to this issue, but it takes a village to combat sex trafficking and serve those who are impacted the most. They told how to identify victims and how to respond to someone with red flags. Trauma informed services, including housing, mental health, advocacy, and healthcare are just a few of the necessary services for victims of this crime to take the next steps forward. LSS Saving Grace program provides support for trafficking victims. LSS Regional Navigator provides a wide range of training opportunities. Everyone has a role; what is yours?

Mary Jo Mettler and BJ Allen – RREAL News from Phebe.

The lights are on in the Phebe Hospital in Bong County Liberia about 120 miles north of Monrovia. Mary Jo traveled to Phebe with the Women of the ELCA in 2012 and was crazy enough to ask "Is it possible to bring solar power to a rural hospital in Liberia?" BJ special projects manager at Rural Renewable Energy Alliance in Pine River, MN said a resounding yes and the movement began. Now a new project "Current for Curran".

Pastor Andy Berry – What would Katie Brew – A history of women in brewing. Pastor Andy an avid brewer, researcher and historian of brewing. He has found that Katie Luther was a very good brewer and it was the women who brewed in that time period. He also researched the ingredients and recipes that Katie may have made and has quite successfully brewed them. He explains the brewing process as well as the history and stories of Katie and Martin. As an evening choice he entertained with samples of Katie's brews, root beer and cider.

An evening pontoon ride was enjoyed by several attendees. A silent auction was help during the 2 days with churches donating the items and the funds going to help women attend the Triennial gathering in Mpls July 13 - 16. You can still register to attend, W/ ELCA will pay half of registration.

Friday's session opened with a welcome and a worship service with Pastor Kari Williamson from Nisswa. We took a break to look and talk to representatives of our Partners in Ministry, EcoFaith Network, The School of Lay Ministry, Global Health Ministries, Lutheran Social Services and Thrivent Action Teams. There was Lots of information on ways to help and patterns for making items. We did a Hymn Study of our theme song "We Are Called" with Karen Bockelman. Karen also gave the Keynote presentation which was very motivational. The Executive Director of the Women of the ELCA, Linda post Bushkofsky, updated us on what is happening nationwide. Joan Iverson, Executive Board Member, and a very inspirational talk. We had a spirit song sing along and a Bible study. We ended with Scholarship sharing, convention report of donations (which was amazing), silent auction total, Traveling Trophies and installation of the new board. We concluded with a Closing Litany.

The facility was wonderful and relaxing, the food was amazing and the rooms were very comfortable. Please consider attending next year. It was very uplifting and hopeful to be with our sisters in the NE Synod. It will be June 4 - 6, 2018 at Sugar Lake.

Here at Grace Lutheran, our Prayer Shawl Ministry supplies yarn to those who would like to knit or crochet a Prayer Shawl for someone who is hurting, happy, sick, or stressed.

The "mystery" of a Prayer Shawl is in the peace, comfort, and warmth that it brings to the maker of the shawl as well as the receiver of the shawl. The pattern is not complicated so that the maker can focus not only on the craft, but also on prayer or a mantra (repeated words of faith or comfort) directed to God for the person who will receive the shawl. Thus the making of a shawl is as much a blessing as the receiving of a shawl.

If you receive a Prayer Shawl USE IT!! Use it at home... Use it when you go out... Use it in exuberance and in joy! May it bring you peace, comfort, warmth, and growth.



EVER WONDERED, "WHY THE COLORS?"



In the Christian tradition colors are used for vestments and paraments, serving to adorn the worship space and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. Today, the ELCA provides a system of colors for use by its congregations and for the most part, the same system is also used by Roman and Anglican churches, at least in the United States.

Colors have different associations across the globe, just as they have had different associations over the course of the church's history. For example, white is the color North American and European Christians typically associate with Christmas and Easter, the color white signifying the purity of Christ, light or joy. In many Eastern cultures, however, white connotes mourning.



A bit about Pastor Cindy:

I moved to goal number three and began the adoption process as a single parent. In 1993, my first daughter arrived from India at the age of 4 months; exactly two years to the day later, my second daughter arrived. Parenting has taught me so much about myself and God's love and support. The girls were both in college when a long-time friendship with a seminary classmate took a romantic turn. Jim and Cindy have been married a year now.

Ministry has always held joys and challenges, but I've always felt that it was what God wanted me to do. My last year at Bethlehem in Aitkin, was exceptionally challenging and by August, I found myself 'burned out'. I resigned my call effective the end of September 2016. The Elephant Rope






